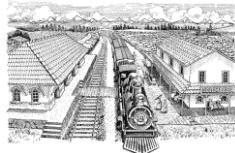

The blossoms in question are elderflowers, the man un paysan, and the cocktail a stylishly simple creation made with St-Germain, the first liqueur in the world created in the artisanal French manner from freshly handpicked elderflower blossoms. Our story, however, does not end there. After gently ushering the wild blossoms into a sack and descending the hillside, the man who gathers blossoms for your cocktail will then mount a bicycle and carefully ride the umbels of starry white flowers to market. There are no more than 40 or 50 men such as he, and in a matter of days they will have gathered and bicycled to us the entirety of what will become St-Germain for that year.

**THE ST-GERMAIN COCKTAIL**

2 PARTS	Brut Champagne or Dry Sparkling Wine
1 1/2 PARTS	St-Germain
2 PARTS	Club Soda

**METHOD:** Fill a tall Collins glass with ice. Add Champagne first, then St-Germain, then Club Soda. Stir completely. \* Garnish with a lemon twist, making sure to squeeze essential oils into glass.


\*St-Germain is heavier than wine, thus it will settle to the bottom unless mixed thoroughly.



**LA ROSETTE\* OR ST-GERMAIN & CHAMPAGNE**

1/2 PART	St-Germain
TOP WITH	Champagne, Brut Rosé,* or Dry Sparkling Wine

**METHOD:** Pour ingredients into a chilled fluted glass and stir lightly. Float half a strawberry, a few raspberries or garnish with a lemon twist. Drink a toast to the elegance of simplicity and the divinity of fraises fraiches.



**THE ST-RITA**

2 PARTS	Tequila Blanco
1 PART	St-Germain
3/4 PART	Freshly Squeezed Lime Juice

**METHOD:** Shake all ingredients with ice and pour into ice-filled rocks glass (salt rim optional). Garnish with lime wedge.



Brothers Robert William and John Harvey built Bruichladdich in 1881 on the edge of the Loch Indaal on the most westerly point of Islay. After several corporate amalgamations, the distillery was found to be “surplus to requirements” and was closed down in 1995. Re-opened in 2002, it produced its First Edition of the “new” Bruichladdich under the guidance and genius of Master Distiller Jim McEwan.
